Piano Professional DVD Review

The Introductory DVD continues to inspire and gather support. The following review, written by Murray McLachlan, appears in the April 2007 issue of Piano Professional Magazine;

"Within a few minutes of watching the new Tobin System Introductory DVD, I felt inspired and embarrassed in equal measure. Inspired by the wonderful common sense and creative enthusiasm of this very practical, fun approach to music, and embarrassed that I had even suspected that it may prove to be superficial and 'trendy'. In fact, what the viewer immediately sees in this short but extremely lucid film is groups of up to nearly twenty school children working with understanding and joy in clapping, singing and activity games with tried and trusted 'French syllables' to help rhythm (the way I was taught), as well as inspiring 'tools' that include cards, 'scale palettes' (the seven degrees presented in a circle on a card) and lots of en masse chanting, done with amusement, logic and energy. I loved the fact that notation is presented with 11 lines in the first place (as opposed to 5), that clefs were referred to as 'G' and 'F' rather than treble and bass, and that chime bars and aural awareness were always to the fore. It was fantastic to see so many under ten year olds coping so well with notation, and obviously improving their cognitive skills and concentration in equal measure. My initial scepticism over a new 'system' of teaching young primary school children the rudiments of music in large groups therefore proved to be completely off the mark, and I have no hesitation in praising Candida Tobin to the skies".
